

## State Representative Vincent Candelora



A recent study by personal finance company WalletHub—widely reported across Connecticut—ranked our state as having the third-highest combined state and local tax burden in the nation. While rankings may fluctuate, one fact remains constant: Connecticut residents already shoulder an overwhelming tax burden.

With that in mind, many are left wonlleagues pushing yet another new tax on

dering: Why are my Democrat colleagues pushing yet another new tax on the public?

They've branded it as a "retail delivery fee"—a .28-cent charge on every package delivered to homes or businesses by a vehicle, including food deliveries. Order a pizza? Pay the fee.

This proposal, originating in the Transportation Committee, has largely flown under the public's radar. However, it has drawn strong opposition from key organizations, including the Connecticut Business and Industry Association, the CT Retailers Network, the Connecticut Restaurant Association, and the CT Food Association. The reason is clear: It's bad for business—especially small businesses—and bad for our economy.

Proponents claim the tax will help fund the Special Transportation Fund (STF), which supports road and bridge repairs. Over time, however, the STF has also been used to cover operating costs for the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Department of Transportation. The gas tax has historically been its primary revenue source, but concerns over the rise of fuel-efficient and electric vehicles have some legislators scrambling for new ways to tax the public.

This retail delivery fee is just another attempt to replace highway tolls—an idea that was abandoned after intense pushback from Connecticut residents. Instead, Democrats installed a highway use tax on trucks, increasing costs on businesses that provide essential services and deliver everyday goods, including groceries. You're already paying for that tax—and you'll pay for this one, too.

But is a new tax even necessary?

Connecticut residents already face one of the highest costs of living in the country. Meanwhile, the Special Transportation Fund is running a surplus—\$125 million in FY25 and \$95 million in FY26—with a deficit not expected until FY28. The STF cumulative balance or reserve fund is projected to grow to \$570 million in FY25 and \$665 million in FY26. The fund is so flush that for two consecutive legislative sessions, the state treasurer has proposed redirecting some of it toward debt reduction.

While inflation has contributed to this surplus, a bigger issue is the Department of Transportation's failure to execute projects efficiently, leaving millions of taxpayer dollars sitting idle. Before imposing yet another tax, residents deserve to see how DOT plans to fix its project backlog.

Supporters argue, "It's only .28 cents," but Connecticut taxpayers know better—new taxes rarely stay small. The Connecticut Restaurant Association warned in its testimony that this fee is the camel's nose under the tent, setting the stage for even higher costs in the future.

This idea isn't new. Other states have either explored or implemented a similar fee, but it remains deeply unpopular, and efforts to stall or repeal it are already underway elsewhere. Connecticut shouldn't follow anyone down this expensive rabbit hole.

Here's a better solution: Instead of taxing deliveries, why not require electric vehicle owners—who currently pay no gas tax but drive heavier cars that contribute to road wear—to contribute through a registration fee? I've proposed a bill to do just that.

After all, we're already paying for their charging stations through the "public benefits" charge on our electric bills.

As I write this, there are murmurs that this bill may not make it through committee—a welcome possibility, but not a reason to let our guard down. Too often, the most insidious taxes, fees, and policies are quietly buried in the budget during the final days of session. Stay tuned.







## Scrap Metal Pickup will be the week of March 31<sup>st</sup> – April 4<sup>th</sup> on your normal trash day.

Scrap Metal includes: Small and large appliances, metal lawn furniture, hot water tanks, tools, metal fencing, furnaces, non-riding lawn mowers with gas removed, outdoor grills, small machines, air conditioners and dehumidifiers.

#### The Leaf Drop-off will be opening on Saturday April 5th.

The drop-off is located around the field to the left of the police station. Be aware that it is Spring and it may be muddy. The leaf drop off will also be open on April 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

Take2Recycling is collecting electronics including TVs, computers, small appliances and almost anything that has a plug. We cannot accept smoke detectors, A/C's or dehumidifiers.

We will also be taking mattresses and box springs (clean and dry), and used oil for free.

When you bring us your mattress, you are creating jobs for those who take them apart to recycle the components.

There is a small fee for recycling propane tanks in reusable condition. Cash only.

## Bulky Waste will be the week of April 14<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> on your normal trash day.

Bulky Waste includes rugs and tree branches (no thicker than 4") if less than 4' long and tied into bundles. Also included are couches, mattresses, wooden furniture and most items that won't fit in your tote. These large items are only taken during bulky waste which is twice a year. For a complete list, see your 2025 yellow Recycling/Trash card.

#### **Bulky Waste will NOT take:**

Electronics including TVs and computers, construction waste, grass clippings, tires, hazardous materials or scrap vehicle parts. It is also not meant for total home cleanouts.

The next Bulky Waste will be in November.

#### Change to North Branford's Plastic Bag Recycling Program

After 8 years of the NB Plastic Film Recycling Program, we have our first major change.

Unfortunately, you will no longer be able to drop the plastic film off at Town buildings. These are Atwater and Smith Libraries, STW Community Center and Town Hall.

#### Why the change?

The program has been so successful, that sometimes there is so much plastic film dropped off, that it causes a bit of unsightliness, with overflowing bins.

As these buildings are cornerstones of North Branford, and perhaps someone's first visit, to our Town, keeping the entrances looking welcoming is paramount.

So, how do we make up for losing these three convenient locations? New recycling bins have been placed at Public Works to accept the plastic film. They are directly in front of you as you drive in the entrance at 290 Forest Road.

The other four drop off locations in NB will remain available. They are: Country Paint and Hardware, Northford Country Market and TJs Launderette.

Additionally, as part of the new process, you will no longer be able to drop off household batteries, eye glasses, and cell phones, at Town Hall. There are bins at Public Works for eye glasses and cell phones. No batteries will be collected, as it's a safety issue. Some retailers such as Staples, Home Depot and Lowes take household batteries for recycling.

Please - If bin is full, please do not leave plastic film outside bin, as getting wet makes things much more difficult to sort.
